Psalm 79 (80) - Lord, tend your vine

This psalm evidently composed in a time of great national trouble, begins with a prayer that the Shepherd (i.e. King) of Israel may, as in the olden days, turn again in friendship towards His people rescue them from all their troubles.

Israel, the God's vine, was lovingly tended by Him in the past. Yet that vine has been uprooted, and must surely perish if the Lord does not intervene. It cannot live without the support of the right hand which has planted it. The psalmist pledges the assurance that if God intervenes on their behalf, the people would no more stray from Him.
