## Psalm 41 (42)

The author of this psalm, once a priest in the temple, is in exile far away from the Jerusalem Temple Jerusalem for which he longs. We find him pining for the House of God, and for the intimacy he once enjoyed with God there. He feels wounded and hurt, and pours out his soul to God in this deeply moving lamentation.

Searching for words to describe his painful need for God, the author of this psalm thinks of the deer, which, in the blazing hot summer, stretches its neck out as far as possible in its search for water in the dried up streams and pools.

His anguish increases as the unbelievers taunt and mock him daily, asking: "Where is your God?" The pagans of those times mocked the Israelites for worshipping a God who could not be seen, and who did not allow representations of Himself to be made. All the pagan religions had idols which could be carried about, so that it did not matter where they were supposed to live. The problem for the Israelite was that he believed, wrongly, that God could only be found in the Temple in Jerusalem.

Trying to relieve the pain, the poet relives those wonderful scenes in the Temple during the great festivals, when he had the privilege of leading the processions into the House of God.
