SAINT RITA OF CASCIA

Tuesday of this week, the 22nd of May, is the memoria of the Fourteenth-century saint, Rita of Cascia. Her feast day was re-introduced into the Church's calendar some years ago by the late Pope Saint John Paul II, who felt that her life and example have much to say to people of our own day.



Rita was born in 1381 at Roccaporena, a small village in Umbria, central Italy, the only child of devout peasant farmers. As a teenager she was attracted to the Religious Life but she married Ferdinand Ferri in deference to her parents' wishes.

Rita became a good wife and mother, but her husband had violent temper; his angry outbursts often ended in him beating Rita. Moreover, he was a heavy drinker and regularly unfaithful to wife. Rita endured her husband's insults and infidelities for eighteen years. But they were blessed with two sons, Giovanni and

Paulo. After many tears and prayers, their broken marriage was healed and they were reconciled. Some weeks later Ferdinand was brought home dead, murdered because of a vendetta waged against him by a fellow villager. His sons wanted to avenge their father, but Rita managed to persuade them to forgive their father's assassin.

Within a year of Ferdinand's death Rita's sons died. Alone, she devoted herself to prayer and penance. Some months later she was admitted to the Augustinian convent in Cascia. Her devotion to Our Lord's Passion was so intense that she shared in it through the mystical experience of a wound in her forehead, which looked as though she had been pierced by a crown of thorns. The wound continued for fifteen years and could not be healed. She died on 22nd May 1457, and was canonised in 1900.

Like St Jude she is invoked as patron saint of desperate cases, but also as patron of couples with marriage difficulties. Her feast is perhaps an opportunity to offer prayer and support to all married couples, but especially those whose relationship, for whatever reason, is strained or tested, that the Lord will renew and heal their love. **Fr. PENTECOST SUNDAY



Today is the fiftieth day after Easter Sunday and the Solemnity of Pentecost when we recall the coming of the Holy Spirit on Our Lady and the Apostles, recorded by Saint Luke in the Acts of the Apostles. The Pentecost event is closely linked with the Sacrament of Confirmation, for this reason we will renew our confirmation

promises at Mass today.

At the end of all Masses this weekend we will offer an anointing with the Oil of Gladness will be given to anyone who would wish to receive it.

This anointing is mentioned in the Prophet Isaiah when he says, "To grant those who mourn in Zion, giving them a garland instead of ashes, the oil of gladness instead of mourning." In the Old Testament this anointing was considered as a powerful means of transmitting the gift of God's Spirit.

Unlike the Sacrament of the Sick, everyone is eligible to be anointed with the Oil of Gladness for spiritual, mental, emotional and physical healing. All of us can benefit from this spiritual healing. I hope that many of you will come to receive this blessing.

On Monday we pick up the Ordinary Season of the Church's year which we left on Shrove Tuesday. During this Season, which will last for the remainder of the Sundays until the end of November, we recall no particular aspect of Our Lord's life on earth but look at it in small episodes which are presented to us the weekday and Sunday Gospels. Green vestments will be used at Mass for the first time in thirteen weeks! Whenever green is used as the liturgical colour it reminds us that as the natural world grows and matures around us, so too should we grow and mature in our faith and in our love of God and our neighbour.
