## THE ARCHANGELS - MICHAEL, GABRIEL AND RAPHAEL

Saturday of this week is the Feast of the Archangels Michael, Gabriel and Raphael. In the underground Chapel of the Angels in the Grotto, there are three stained glass windows, where the Archangels are depicted. Who are the Archangels and why do we honour them?

ichael in Hebrew means 'who is like God?' He is often known as 'The prince of the heavenly host', and is usually pictured as a strong warrior, dressed in battle armour. His name appears in the Bible four times: twice in the Old Testament Book of Daniel, and once in the New Testament, in the Letter of St. Jude and the Book of Revelation. In the latter we learn about a great battle in heaven, with St. Michael and his angels combatting Lucifer and



the other fallen angels. It is for this reason that Saint Michael is invoked as a helper in our daily fight against the devil, hence the old prayer: 'St. Michael the Archangel, defend us in battle. Be our safeguard against the wickedness and snares of the Devil. May God rebuke him, we humbly pray, and do thou, O Prince of the heavenly host, by the power of God, thrust into hell Satan, and all the wicked spirits, who wander through the world for the ruin of souls. Amen.'

The Feast day is often referred to as 'Michaelmas' - in Academic circles it marks the first term of the new academic year in many of the old universities like St. Andrews, Glasgow... Meanwhile in the Legal world 'Michaelmas' refers to the first of the four terms into which the legal year is divided by the Courts. A 'Red Mass' (in St Mary's Cathedral, Edinburgh) is celebrated on the Sunday nearest the feast to call down God's blessing upon the legal profession.

Abriel in Hebrew means 'God is my strength'. He appears three times in the Bible as a messenger sent by God: he was sent to Daniel in the Old Testament to explain a vision concerning the Messiah; he appeared to Zachariah when he was offering incense in the Temple, to foretell the birth of his son, John the Baptist; and most famously of all he was sent to the house of Mary in Nazareth to tell her that she was chosen to be the mother of God's divine Son at the Annunciation. His words to Mary, often called 'the Angelic Salutation', so simple and yet so full of meaning, 'Hail Mary, full of grace, the Lord is with thee', have become the first line of the prayer 'the Hail Mary'. Saint Gabriel, the messenger, is the patron saint of those who work in the communications industries: broadcasters, postal workers etc.

Raphael in Hebrew means 'God has healed'. He is mentioned in the Old Testament Book of Tobit: here Raphael first appears disguised in human form as the travelling companion of Tobit's son, Tobias, calling himself 'Azarias.' During the course of the journey the archangel's protection is shown most notably in the healing of Tobit who has become blind. Eventually Azarias makes himself known as 'the angel Raphael, one of the seven, who stand before the Lord.' Raphael because of his travels with Tobias is seen as the patron of travellers. In centuries past he was revered as a special protector of sailors: in the Doge's Palace in Venice, there is a statue depicting Raphael holding a scroll on which is written: 'Efficia fretum quietum' (Keep the Gulf quiet - referring to the Gulf of Venice; the Venetians were great sailors). In the Fifteeth century when the Portuguese explorer Vasco Da Gama set out from Lisbon to sail to India, the flagship of the flotilla was named the St. Raphael. When they reached the Cape of Good Hope in South Africa, the sailors disembarked and erected a column with a statue of Raphael for having seen them safely round the Cape and its notorious waters. Fr. ## NEXT SUNDAY IS LITTLE FLOWER SUNDAY

Saint Thérèse of Lisieux, who, since the early 1920's, has had a special place at the Shrine of Our Lady of Lourdes, Carfin. At the conclusion of the Vigil Mass and the two Sunday Masses there will be an opportunity to receive an individual blessing with the Relic of the Saint.

At 7pm there will be a Torchlight Rosary Procession in the Grotto, followed by the Litany of Saint Therese, Veneration of the Relic and Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament in the Parish Church. Light refreshments will be served in the Xavier Centre afterwards. Please join us if you can.

CALENDAR - Wednesday is the memorial of the martyrs Sts. Cosmas and Damian who died in 303AD. Tradition holds they were twin brothers and physicians who never charged a fee for their medical services. On Thursday we remember St. Vincent De Paul (+1660). He founded the Congregation of the Priests of the Mission to preach especially to country people. With the help of Saint Louise de Marillac he established the Sisters of Charity to care for the needy and orphans. Saint Lawrence Ruiz (a Filipino husband and father) and Companions - known as the martyrs of Nagasaki - are remembered on Friday. Saturday is the Feast of the Archangels, Michael, Gabriel and Raphael.
