FEAST OF THE DEDICATION OF THE BASILICAS OF SAINT PETER AND SAINT PAUL IN ROME

Yesterday we celebrated the Feast of the Dedication of two great Roman Basilicas: Saint Peter's at the Vatican and Saint Paul-outside-the-Walls on the Ostian Way.



The Basilica of Saint Peter stands on the site of the Emperor Nero's circus, that is to say, the place where the Roman Games, chariot races and gladiator fights etc. took place. Saint Peter was executed here in 64AD, on, as tradition says, an upside down cross. The historians tell us that the last thing the Apostle would have seen was the great stone obelisk that today stands at the centre of Saint Peter's Square. The Emperor Caligula had the obelisk brought to Rome in 37AD. It was the largest non-inscribed obelisk to leave Egypt. Much of the original circus is under the Basilica and Square.

Saint Peter was buried by his fellow Christians on the Vatican Hill, and great veneration was given to his tomb. At the beginning of the fourth century the Emperor Constantine, had a Basilica built over it. When finished, the edifice was solemnly consecrated by Pope Saint Sylvester. The construction of a new Basilica was begun in 1506 - the present Saint Peter's - and it was consecrated by Pope Urban VIII on 18th November 1626, hence the date of the Feast on the 18th of November.

Excavations, carried out in secret at the request of Pope Pius XII, during the Second World War, showed that the present Basilica was built over the tomb of Saint Peter, just as the previous Basilica had been. These excavations, which lie two stories beneath the main floor of the Basilica (immediately underneath are the tombs of the Popes, called the 'Vatican Grottos'), and which are known as the 'Scavi', can be visited by pilgrims, although in order to preserve this exceptional archaeological site, only around 250 visitors per day are permitted to enter. The 'Scavi' are well worth seeing if you ever visit the Eternal City!

The Basilica of Saint Paul-outside-the-Walls, situated at the other end of the city on the *Via Ostiense*, is built near the place Saint Paul was martyred - Paul as a Roman citizen was not allowed to be put to death within the city walls - he was beheaded outside.

Over his tomb a Basilica was built during the reign of the Emperor Constantine; it survived for more than 1400 years. However, the Pauline Basilica was almost completely destroyed by fire in 1823. Rebuilt according to its original layout by Popes Gregory XVI and Pius IX, it was the latter who consecrated it in 1854, on the occasion of the proclamation of the Dogma of the Immaculate Conception. In this Basilica there are portraits of every Pope from the time of Saint Peter - with room for many more! It is looked after today by Benedictine monks, and its Archpriest is the American Cardinal James Harvey. *Rev. F. McGachey*

CALENDAR - On Tuesday we celebrate the Presentation of Our Lady in the Temple, a feast which dates back to 5th century Jerusalem. The 3rd century Roman martyr and patroness of musicians, St. Cecilia, is honoured on Wednesday. On Thursday we remember St. Clement (+100) the third Pope after St. Peter, whose Letter to the Corinthians is of great importance. On Friday we recall the two and a half centuries of persecution sustained by the Church in Vietnam. There were 130,000 victims, of whom 117 have been canonised. They include the Vietnamese priest St. Andrew Dun Lac, and St. Theophane Venard, whose writings inspired St.Therese of Lisieux to offer herself for the missions. On Saturday we recall in the liturgy St. Catherine of Alexandria. Her picturesque legend ends with her death by beheading and established a devotion which lasted many centuries and made her patroness of philosophers and artillerymen.
