OUR LADY OF FATIMA

The apparitions of Our Lady to the three children of Fatima took place in the summer of 1917. Portugal had been in state of turmoil: one government falling after another, with each successive regime more atheistic than the previous one. In many ways they wanted to do what the French revolutionaries hoped to do but failed to achieve in the late seventeen hundreds - to wipe out all trace of religion from the country.

The inhabitants of Fatima were mostly poor people, with little education, many of them small farmers who tended their fields and animals. The three children who received the apparitions had been brought up in an atmosphere of poverty but were rich in piety: Lucia



dos Santos (ten years old) [far left] and her two younger cousins, Francisco (nine) and Jacinta (seven). On Sunday 13th May 1917, towards noon, the children had taken a small flock of sheep to graze at the Cova da Iria, a spot outside of Fatima. They prayed the rosary, and after they had eaten their lunch, a flash of lightning caught their attention. They saw the figure of a woman, dressed in dazzling white, hovering above a small oak tree. She asked them to pray the rosary for peace, and to offer up penances and sacrifices for the conversion of sinners. She also invited them to come back on the 13th day of each month for five more months.

At this time the Mayor of the district, Artur de Oliveira Santos, a Freemason, devised a scheme to discredit the apparitions by terrorising the children: he tried to bully them into admitting they had lied, threatening to boil them in oil unless they recanted what they had said. Thrown in jail they were unable to see the Lady on August 13th but she would appear to them on the 19th August after they were released.

In the final apparition on the 13th of October, the "Lady" identified herself as "Our Lady of the Rosary" and said: "I have come to exhort the faithful to change their lives, to avoid grieving Our Lord by sin; to pray the Rosary. I desire that a chapel be built here in my honour." That same day an inexplicable phenomenon took place: the sun seemed to tumble from the sky and crash towards the earth; it then travelled across the sky, zigzagging as it went. A crowd of 70,000 saw this phenomenon, and it was reported by the world's press.

The two younger children died during the so-called Spanish Flu epidemic which swept through Europe: Francisco in 1919, and Jacinta in 1920. Lucia would die in 2005, at her Carmelite convent in Coimbra, Portugal, after a long illness. Official recognition of the apparitions came in 1930, and since then, Popes have shown exceptional favour toward Fatima: Pius XII, Paul VI, and John Paul II in particular making visits to the shrine. Last year on the 13th May, Pope Francis declared Francisco and Jacinta to be saints during a Mass that was attended by an estimated 750,000 people.

CALENDAR - **Monday** is the feast of **Saint Matthias** - the *Acts of the Apostles* tells us that he was the one chosen by the Holy Spirit and the Apostles to replace Judas Iscariot. **Saint Isidore** (+1130) is remembered on **Tuesday**. He was a Spanish labourer who worked most of his life as a ploughman for a nobleman who lived near Madrid. Although working many hours a day, he never failed to attend daily Mass, and spend time praying before the Blessed Sacrament. He married a maid-servant, Maria de la Cabeza, who was also a saint. They were always willing to help their neighbours and worked with the poor in the city slums. **St. John I**, Pope and Martyr (+526) is honoured on **Thursday**. A native of Tuscany, he served for many years as the Archdeacon of Rome before being elected Pope at an advanced age. After his election his life and ministry were thrown into turmoil thanks to the interference of the Emperor Theodoric. When Saint John refused to comply with the Emperor's wishes, he was thrown in jail where he starved to death.
