# A NEW BRITISH SAINT...

n Wednesday of last week Pope Francis authorised the Congregation for the Causes of Saints to issue a decree which attributed a second miracle to the intercession of Blessed Cardinal John Henry Newman. Two authenticated miracles are required before sainthood, and Newman, who was already credited with curing a man's spinal disease, is now said to have healed a pregnant American woman from a severe bleeding. She had long been a devotee of Blessed John Henry, and in prayer she directly and explicitly invoked Newman's intercession to stop the bleeding. The miraculous healing was immediate, complete, and permanent.



Newman, a theologian and scholar, who was one of the highest profile Anglicans to convert to Catholicism during the Victorian era, will be Britain's first saint since 1976, when the Scot, Saint John Ogilvie, was canonised.

Born in London in 1801, his father was a banker from the Evangelical wing of the Anglican Church. At the age of fifteen Newman experienced a religious conversion which would become the foundation of his lifelong faith in God. He matriculated at Trinity College, Oxford, and then applied for a fellowship at Oriel College. Around this time Newman was ordained a priest in the

Church of England, working for seventeen years as vicar of the University Church, St Mary the Virgin. In these years he published eight volumes of *Parochial and Plain Sermons* as well as two novels; and his poem, *The Dream of Gerontius* (from the Latin meaning 'old man') was set to music by the Catholic composer Sir Edward Elgar.

After 1833, Newman was a prominent member of the *Oxford Movement*, which emphasised the Church's debt to the Church Fathers (the great writers of the first eight centuries). Historical research made Newman suspect that the Roman Catholic Church was in closest continuity with the Church that Jesus established.

In 1845, he became a Roman Catholic with the help of the Italian priest Blessed Dominic Barberi. Two years later he was ordained a Catholic priest in Rome and joined the *Congregation of the Oratory*, founded three centuries earlier by St Philip Neri. Returning to England, Newman founded Oratory houses in Birmingham and London, and for seven years served as Rector of the Catholic University of Ireland.

Newman would write forty books and more than twenty thousand letters all of which survive today. His two most famous works are his *Essay on the Development of Christian Doctrine*, and his *Apologia Pro Vita Sua* (his spiritual autobiography up to 1864). He accepted the First Vatican Council's teaching on Papal Infallibility while noting its limits - which many people who favoured that definition were reluctant to do.

When Newman was named a Cardinal in 1879, he took as his motto 'Cor ad cor loquitur' (Heart speaks to heart). He died in 1890 at the age of eighty-nine. More than fifteen thousand people lined the streets for his funeral. Pope Benedict XVI beatified Newman in September 2010, at Crofton Park, near Birmingham. While underling his great intellect, Benedict also praised his pastoral zeal for the sick, the poor, the bereaved and those in prison. He will be made a saint in the autumn. **Father McGachey**

ednesday is the memorial of **Francisco and Jacinta Marto** (pictured) who were declared saints of the Church by Pope Francis on 13<sup>th</sup> May 2017, at Fatima in Portugal. The brother and sister were tending their sheep, with their cousin Lucia

dos Santos, in the fields at the Cova da Iria, near Fatima, in 1917 when they witnessed an apparition of the Our Lady, who asked them to come back between May and October that year. Less than two years later, Francisco died of influenza at his family home; he was buried in the parish cemetery. Jacinta died of influenza in Lisbon, offering her suffering for the conversion of sinners, peace in the world and the Holy Father. They were both re-buried in the Fatima Basilica in the early 1950s. Their cousin Lucia became a Carmelite nun and died in 2005. The shrine of Our Lady of Fatima is



visited by around 20 million people every year. On Thursday we remember St. Peter Damian. Brought up in abject poverty, he became a hermit at Fontavellana in Italy, in the early part of the eleventh century. He was plucked from obscurity, and became widely known for his preaching and writing, and as a famous reformer, working with the Popes of his day to bring stability to the Church. Friday is the Feast of the Chair of Saint Peter - the Chair or See of Saint Peter is Rome, and it is a day of special prayer for his Holiness the Pope. St. Polycarp of Smyrna is honoured on Saturday. He converted to Christianity with the help of St. John the Evangelist, and was a friend of St. Ignatius of Antioch. He became bishop of Smyrna (now Izmir in Turkey). When he was eighty-six years old, he was arrested for being a Christian, and was urged him to renounce Christ and save his life. But St. Polycarp said, "For eighty-six years I have served Him and he has never wronged me. How can I renounce the King who has saved me?" He suffered martyrdom in 155AD.
