ALL SOULS' DAY AND PURGATORY


riday of this week is the Commemoration of the Faithful Departed, more commonly known as All Souls' Day. After rejoicing the day before - All Saints Day - with those of her children who have entered the glory of heaven, today She prays for all those who, in the purifying effects of purgatory await the day when they will be joined to the company of saints.



Will you honour the dead? Do not spend yourselves in unprofitable lamentations: choose rather to sing psalms, to give alms, and to lead a holy life. Do for them what they would willingly do for themselves, were they to return again into the world; and God will accept it at your hands as if it came from them... Let us not hesitate to help those who have died and to offer our prayers for them. *From the writings of St John Chrysostom* (+407)

We must not make purgatory into a flaming concentration camp of the brink of Hell - or even a 'Hell for a short time.' It is blasphemous to think of it as a place where a petty God exacts final punishment...Saint Catherine of Genoa, a mystic of the fifteenth century, wrote that the 'fire' of purgatory is God's love 'burning' the soul so that, at last, the soul is wholly aflame. It is the pain of wanting to be made totally worthy of One who is seen as infinitely lovable, the pain of desire for union that is now absolutely assured, but not yet fully tasted. A priest started his homily at a funeral by saying: "I am going to speak about judgment." There was dismay in the congregation. Then he went on: "Judgment is whispering into the ear of a merciful and compassionate God the story of my life which I have never been able to tell." Many of us have a story, or part of one at any rate, about which we have never been able to speak to anyone. Fear of being misunderstood, inability to understand ourselves, ignorance of the darker side of our hidden lives, or just shame, make it very difficult for many people. Our true story is not told, or only half of it is. What a relief it will be to be

able to whisper freely and fully into that merciful and compassionate ear. After all that is what he has always wanted. He waits for us to come home to Him. He receives us, his prodigal children, now contrite and humble, with an embrace. In that embrace we start telling Him our story, and he begins that process of healing and preparation which we call purgatory. *From a talk of Cardinal Basil Hume*, *Archbishop of Westminster* (+1999)

Our souls demand purgatory, don't they? Would it not break the heart if God said to us, "It is true, my child, that your breath smells and your rags drip with mud and slime, but we are charitable here and no one will upbraid you for these things, or draw away from you. Enter into joy"? Should we not reply, "Thank you, sir, but if there is no objection, I'd rather be cleansed first." The practice of offering up the Holy Sacrifice for the souls in purgatory comes down from the earliest Christian times, and the Church has ever laid much stress upon this virtuous and charitable custom. THURSDAY IS THE SOLEMNITY OF ALL SAINTS HOLYDAY OF OBLIGATION


The Solemnity when we remember those men, women and children of all times and places who are now with God in heaven, including our family members and friends, and others whom we have known in this life.

INDULGENCES FOR ALL SOULS' WEEK

n indulgence is a remission of temporal punishment due to sin, the guilt of which has been forgiven. An indulgence, applicable only to the souls in Purgatory, is granted to the faithful, who devoutly visit a cemetery and pray, even if only mentally, for the departed. The indulgence is plenary each day from the first to the eighth of November; on other days of the year it is partial.

MASS OF REMEMBERANCE FOR THE DEAD OF THE PARISH

To remember those who have died since the Parish was founded 150 years ago, priests and people alike, and most especially those who have died over the past twelve months, will take place on Saturday 17th November at 10am.

ANNUAL CEMETERY SERVICE - At Saint Patrick's Cemetery, New Stevenston, will take place on Sunday 18th November at 2pm. Fr. Chromy will be looking after the Liturgy.



CALENDAR - Thursday is the Solemnity of All Saints. Friday is the Commemoration of the Faithful Departed or All Souls' Day. On Saturday the Church celebrates the feast of St. Martin de Porres. He was born in Peru in 1579, the son of a Spanish knight and a woman of African descent from Panama. Martin inherited the features and dark complexion of his mother, and for that reason his noble father eventually turned him out of his house. After working as a surgeon's apprentice, he joined the Dominicans as a lay brother and was put in charge of the infirmary of a friary in Lima. Soon he was caring for the sick of the city, as well as the slaves who had been brought to Peru from Africa — not to mention the animals with which he is often pictured. Martin during his life, and especially after death, was a worker of miracles.
