The custom of saying a decade of the Rosary each day as part of our daily prayers at school, the crowning of the statue of Our Lady...

Many of us too would have attended May Devotions in honour of Our Blessed Lady in the Church. On Wednesday at 7pm there will be traditional May Devotions: a prayerful recitation of the Rosary, the Litany of Loreto, with its beautiful titles of Our Lady, Benediction of the Most Blessed Sacrament, and the traditional hymns in honour of Our Lady. I hope very much that you will join us.

GROTTO SEASON 2018

he Grotto Season 2018 begins on Tuesday 1st May. This year's diary is as busy as ever, with parish groups, school groups, groups from other parts of the UK and abroad. As of the 1st of May Eucharistic Adoration will move from the Parish Church to the Glass Chapel, from 10.30am until 7pm each day. On Mondays and Tuesdays there will be a simple Evening Prayer and Benediction in the Glass Chapel at 7pm. On Wednesdays at 7pm we will have devotions in the Parish Church. On the other days Exposition will finish simply at 7pm.

A NEW PUBLICATION

or the past few years I have tried to bring out some new publications to coincide with the new Grotto Season. This year I have published a booklet entitled 'The Fatima Apparitions' - it gives a faithful account of the apparitions of Our Lady to the three children, Lucia, Francisco and Jacinta, which took place between May and October 1917, as well as the authentic 'Fatima Prayers' which the children were taught by Our Lady, and the Prayer for the Consecration of Scotland to the Immaculate Heart of Mary which was used during the National Mass last year in September. The booklets are 30 pages long and are modestly priced at £2.00 each. The proceeds from the sale of the booklets will go the Grotto. They can be found in the porch of the Church and the statue of Our Lady of Fatima.

CALENDAR - Monday is the memorial of Pope St. Pius V. Born in 1504, he joined the Dominicans at the age of fourteen, and was sixty-two when he was elected Pope. His papacy, though short, was one of the most fruitful of the sixteenth century. To the Reformers who had begun the Reformation, Pius replied by applying the decrees of the Council of Trent for the reform of the Church from within. Being a Dominican he wore a white habit, and after his election as Pope he continued to wear it - hence the reason today why the Pope wears a white cassock. Tuesday is the feast of St. Joseph the Worker, established by Pope Pius XII in 1955 in order to Christianise the concept of human labour and give to all worker a role model and protector. Joseph's work must have been arduous and unrewarding, but he offered it to God with patience, and no doubt with a cheerful heart. Thursday is the Feast of the Apostles Sts. Philip and James. Philip was one of the first disciples to chosen soon after his Jesus' baptism in the Jordan. St. James the Lesser, a brother of the Apostle Jude, was from Cana in Galilee. He is the author of one of the Letters in the New Testament, and was favoured by an appearance of the Risen Christ, which we read about in Paul's First Letter to the Corinthians. After Pentecost he became Bishop of Jerusalem. His relics lie next to those of St. Philip in the Basilica of the Holy Twelve Apostles (Santi Dodici Apostoli) in Rome.
